About the Club

The Spring City Cycling Club (SCCC) of Huntsville, Alabama, was founded in 1892 and consists of individuals who share a common interest in bicycling. The club offers a wide variety of bicycling activities suitable for all cycling enthusiasts. The club hosts local rides each week throughout the year and participates in bicycle advocacy activities for Huntsville and the surrounding areas. The club organizes an annual USAC-sanctioned race in the summer and a century ride in the fall.

Rides

The club offers a full complement of rides to satisfy riders of all abilities (beginner to advanced). A slow-paced breakfast ride that promotes rider camaraderie is offered each Sunday and participants in a faster-paced ride meet this group at Mullin's Restaurant in Five Points for breakfast.

Each Saturday a member-led ride is offered. These rides range in distance from 25 to 100 miles with paces from 12 to 20 mph.

During Daylight Savings Time, group rides are held after work on most weekdays. These rides include road rides ranging from 12 to 35 miles.

Race Division

The Race Division of the SCCC exists for those members who are primarily interested in riding

fast and racing. The Race Division promotes and sponsors a series of formal and informal rides, races, and time trials. Weekly training races provide members with experience in various race formats.

The Race Division also sponsors a yearly, USAC-sanctioned race weekend in Huntsville consisting of a road race and a criterium. A complete schedule of Race Division events is available on the club website.

Club Special Events

The club holds several outings a year ranging from picnics to campouts. These outings are usually centered around one ride or a series of rides.

The SCCC celebrates May as National Bike Month with special novice and family rides and Ride to Work recognition.

The SCCC hosts the All You Can Eat Century each year in September. This ride tours northeast Madison County and southern Tennessee and offers many ride options between 25 and 107 miles and is followed by an "all you can eat" meal.

Bicycle Advocacy

The SCCC works with local organizations to help promote bicycle rights and awareness. The club promotes and endorses planning for highway, road, and street projects that provide continued access and routes for bicycle travel

and recreation in the Huntsville area and across Alabama.

SCCC Ride-A-Metric (RAM) Training Series

Every Spring the Spring City Cycling Club offers its Ride A Metric (RAM) training series. This training series will help participants progress from neighborhood or casual riders to cyclists who are confident about riding on the road. This program is intended to prepare riders for the SCCC All You Can Eat Metric Century (62 miles), but is also an excellent development program for those who wish to ride shorter distances on the road.
